Activity 3 - Describing Places in the Community

Instructions: Ask the student to describe each of the places/events below in detail. Encourage the student to talk about personal experiences in each situation. Present prompts to elicit additional information. Use Worksheets 3-1 through 3-9 to record responses.

1. What is a hair salon (barber shop)?

Sample response: A hair salon is a place where people go to get their hair cut. Customers tell the stylist how they want their hair to look. The stylist uses scissors, razors, and electric trimmers to cut hair.

2. What is a supermarket?

Sample response: A supermarket is a large food store where people go to buy food that they use at home to prepare meals. Food is stored on shelves and in bins at the store. Different types of food are located in different parts of the store. You put the food you want to buy into a shopping cart and take it up to the front of the store to pay for it.

3. What is a restaurant?

Sample response: A restaurant is a place that serves food to the public. You sit at a table and select the food you want from a menu. A server brings the food that you order. You pay for the meal after you finish eating.

4. What is a school?

Sample response: A school is a place where instruction is provided to students by a teacher. The school has classrooms where the instruction is given. Each classroom has a teacher who helps the students learn new things. Computers are used in many schools for classroom lessons. Many schools also have a library with many books to choose from.

5. What is a circus?

Sample response: A circus is a place where people go to see animals, acrobats, and clowns perform. The performances take place in a large tent. Animals do tricks and clowns do things to make people laugh. The circus performers often travel from town to town to put on a show for the people.

6. What is a city?

Sample response: A city is an area of land that has its own government officials such as a mayor. Each city has its own set of laws and regulations. There are buildings, houses, and roads in a city.

7. What is an airport?

Sample response: An airport is a place where aircraft can land and take off. People board airplanes at the airport to travel to different parts of the world. You pay for a boarding pass and then get on a plane that takes you where you want to go. Aircraft can be repaired at the airport.


